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Who Are We?

Each month, we will highlight a member of our Editorial Board. Last month, we started with Richard B. North, MD, our Editor-in-Chief. This month, we introduce Jane Shipley, our Managing Editor.

As a college student, Jane edited scientific papers for non-native English speakers on the faculty of The Johns Hopkins School of [Hygiene and] Public Health's Department of Biochemistry [and Molecular Biology]. After earning her BA in Ancient Languages (Latin and Greek) from William and Mary, Jane first worked as a lab assistant and then as a copy editor/proofreader for the *Journal of Urology*. She moved on to teach English and Latin, write material promoting the City of Baltimore's dollar house program, and serve as Executive Director of the Chicago Chapter of the American Institute of Architects (AIA) and, later, of the Baltimore Chapter of the AIA. When she was homeschooling her children (for secular reasons), she abstracted approximately 6,000 scientific publications for POPLINE, a Johns Hopkins database. Jane then worked for six years as a writer/editor at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine and also taught writing at the Maryland Institute College of Art. Since 2001, she has co-authored 27 scientific publications and dozens of posters in the field of pain medicine and neuromodulation and made presentations to NANS, the INS, and the AAPM. She has served on four clinical trial steering

committees and conducts peer reviews. In 2007, she became the founding Executive Director of The Neuromodulation Foundation, which launched WIKISTIM in 2012.



What Are We Working On?

1. We have submitted a manuscript describing WIKISTIM for publication in an appropriate journal and an abstract on WIKISTIM for the NANS meeting in January 2019.
2. Continuing to fill in data sheets with the help of authors and study sponsors. This month we sent one back to the study sponsor for review and completed another for: Thomson SJ, Tavakkolizadeh M, Love-Jones S, Patel NK, Gu JW, Bains A, Doan Q, Moffitt M. Effects of rate on analgesia in kilohertz frequency spinal cord stimulation: results of the PROCO randomized controlled trial. *Neuromodulation* 21(1):67-76, 2018.
3. Creating our new section on noninvasive brain stimulation and uploading the 16 completed data sheets and list of citations supplied by our editorial board member, Dr. Jonathan Young.
4. Performing our first major update of the *Practice Parameters for the Use of Spinal Cord Stimulation in the Treatment of Chronic Neuropathic Pain*, to be renamed *Spinal Cord Stimulation in the Treatment of Chronic Pain: A Guide to Current Practice*. We will submit the update for publication in an appropriate journal and will also reconfigure the website (www.neuromodfound.org) so that we will be able to update it more readily.

What You Might Find Helpful

WIKISTIM data sheets are useful for study design and manuscript preparation. We urge you to fill them in as you prepare a study report or, better still, as you design a study. You can download data sheets from prior studies to use as templates or starting points. Once a data sheet has been completed, it can be used not only to help write a primary study report but also the secondary reports that often follow, thus ensuring consistency. Simply using an adjacent column for the follow-on report helps prevent embarrassing typos and mistakes from appearing in final published form.
